Who we are.

- Advance the education of children in an engaging and stimulating manner through a high quality performing arts experience.
- Help alleviate poverty, discrimination and disadvantage.

What personal data we collect and what we do with it.

We collect the following personal data from you:

- Basic contact details: Collected on our registration and consent form. Included in this data are your name, your child's name, date of birth of child, phone number, home address, email address, gender, ethnicity, school, medical details and emergency contact details. The GDPR classes all the above as personal data.
- Social media details: Many of you contact with Young & Talented via social media.

Getting in touch and keeping in touch:

If you contact us by email, letter or telephone, through our website or by any other means we use this information so we can send you relevant information on how to join.

How we use your personal data

The processing of your personal data is necessary for the performance of Y&T to enable us to communicate with our students and their parents. We use your personal data for the following purposes:

- Current students at Young & Talented and their parents/guardians - we use the data to make contact via email, phone or post to inform of term dates, show dates, fees, castings and other special events.
- We use this data to report back to funders on student numbers, ages and ethnicity.
- For students on the Tower Hamlets Mainstream Grant programme we are also required to give the postcode to the funders as evidence of residence in Tower Hamlets.
- For past students and our extended friends and supporters of Y&T we send e-newsletters to update on recent news, opportunities and to celebrate the achievements of our Y&T students and team.

Legal grounds for processing

Data protection law requires us to only process your personal data if we satisfy one or more legal grounds. These are set out in data protection law and we rely on a number of different grounds for the processing we carry out. These are as follows:

Consent

In certain circumstances, we process your personal data after obtaining your consent to do so for the purposes of:

- Sending you communications about our services.
- Sharing your name, email address, postal address and telephone number with our centre coordinators so they can call or email you about session dates and opportunities.

Necessary for the purposes of our legitimate interests

It is sometimes necessary to collect and use your personal data for legitimate purposes:

- To provide you with services that are as useful and beneficial, after discussion with you.
- To respond to any enquiries from casting directors, after discussion with you.
- Where required by law.
